ifty years ago, Dartmouth was prepping to print the dark green covered, paper booklet entitled "Application for Admissions, September 1975." On the inside cover in a box was written: "YOUR FIRST STEP: Remove the staples from this booklet." e are very excited that our next Sitting on the '79 Fence session on May'l will feature **Peter Robinson** '79 interviewed by his friend and classmate, **John Bussey** '79. awards for international coverage. John contributed a first-person story to a package of articles on the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks that also received the Pulitzer Prize.

Peter is the Murdoch Distinguished Policy Fellow at the Hoover Institution, where he writes about business and politics, edits the Hoover Digest, and hosts the video program, Uncommon Knowledge. At Dartmouth, he majored in English then obtained a Master's at Oxford. Peter spent six years in the White House as a speech writer, first for Vice President George Bush and then for President Ronald Reagan. He wrote the historic Berlin Wall address in which President Reagan called on Mikhail Gorbachev to "tear down this wall!" Peter has served as a Dartmouth Trustee and is the author of three books: *How* Ronald Reagan Changed My Life; It's My Party: A Republican's Messy Love Affair with the GOP; and Snapshots from Hell: The Making of an MBA.

Peter will be interviewed by John Bussey '79. For 41 years, John has worked for *The Wall Street Journal* as associate editor, deputy editor in chief, columnist, bureau chief in Washington, Hong Kong and Tokyo, economics editor, foreign editor, and features editor on the page-one staff. His staff has won three Pulitzer Prizes and six Overseas Press Club

- Tent-based coffee, tea & snack manager



Darkness in the Daytime: 79s at the Total Solar Eclipse in Texas

ow, you would have thought that April weather prospects in Texas would be better than April weather prospects in New Hampshire, and you would not be alone. In fact, the entire astronomy community was committed to that prediction for the Total Solar Eclipse, and along with many others we duly traveled to Killeen, TX to see this amazing spectacle. And, wouldn't you know it, New England - typically a cloudy mess in April – was blazing clear, and

Texas, usually blazing clear in April, was mostly cloudy. But that did not stop us from glimpsing the totally eclipsed Sun – a wonder to all the members of our trip of 22 enthusiasts who came along on the trip I led with my friend Matt Putnam, including fellow '79s Tim Gent, Tim Sykes, and Joe Giammarco, with respective spouses.

After five days of touring in central Texas, including some hiking, a fascinating mammoth excavation site, some

interesting wineries, and a fascinating community that still participates in many old fashioned crafts, we prepared for our eclipse observing. I had the chance to do three public lectures while we were there one addressing astronomy, space science, and the environment; one on the science of the Sun; and one on eclipses and experiencing the event. Eclipse day dawned with high clouds, but thicker layers moved in as the eclipse began. We could see the moon progressing over the Sun through gaps here and there....but the Sun was hidden as totality began. A few breaks during the 4:15 of totality we were granted gave us a chance to see the corona and some very



bright prominences....and we certainly celebrated as totality ended and the rest of the partial eclipse concluded.

I am so happy to have brought our classmates out to see this a total eclipse is the single most amazing natural phenomenon one can experience. It must have been quite an event for everyone – before it was over they were already hooked and talking - seriously - about setting up trips to the eclipses in '26 (Iceland and Spain) and '27 (Egypt)! I'm really hoping we all stay healthy and come to New England for the next eclipse that comes here....in 2079....for our 100th reunion. Who's up for that?!
