Serving on the Board of DPCS as Treasurer I"qet" to be a mentor once in a while. This past spring, for the first time in 7 years, I got to mentor Austin Hyun, a 2023 from southern California. Austin was working at the LISTEN Thrift Center in the Hanover area this past spring term. Austin was

working for Executive Director

Angela Zane D'12 as an Analyst.

We met a half dozen times during the ten weeks, several times on Zoom, twice in his office and then a final restaurant dinner at the end. Coincidentally, Austin's job required him to understand and use Excel to help analyze inventory turnover and design/administer/interpret an employee survey. While I'll suggest that almost any 79 could have helped with these projects, the fact I had some actual experience with Excel/turnover/surveys in my 16 different corporate experiences worked to some advantage for Austin.

What is fantastic about the experience is seeing GenZ/iKids in action. Understanding

the thought processes and interactive capabilities of a generation through your mentee is a rewarding experience. Laughter lowers the age barriers and these kids just aren't as serious as the GenXers.

We have had 78 different classmate mentors in our DPCS class project with 108 mentees over the past 22 years. Would you like to be considered to be

> a mentor? If you are in Boston, Philadelphia or San Francisco markets I'd be particularly


