# Letter from the Editor

## Lifelong Curiosity and Learning Beyond the Green

**C**oronations do not happen that often; the last one in 1953 was before we were born. No matter how you feel about British Royalty, this May's coronation of King Charles III will be woven into the fabric of history.

I have long been fascinated by the many layers of British history from the geologic ([William Smith](#)), ancient ([Doggerland](#)), Celts, Roman, Viking, Saxon, Norman, invasion, migration, commerce, geography, science, arts, and writing. All humanity is a tapestry woven by those who came before. Could May's "crowning" moment, this thread, provide a theme for our newsletter?

The coronation site—London and its Underground—provided both the answer and inspiration. My curiosity had uncovered a treasure trove of iconic design elements for my theme.

**The Font:** In 1913 [Frank Pick](#), the commercial manager of "The Underground Group" commissioned [Edward Johnston](#) to develop a font to strengthen the Group's corporate identity. In his design, Johnston had been inspired by Roman inscriptions for their readability and beauty. Introduced in 1916, the iconic [Johnston Font](#) font became "...one of the world's longest-lasting examples of corporate branding." In 1979, the font was redesigned for phototypesetting as [New Johnston](#). In 2012, Transport

for London (TfL) had [Johnston 100](#) designed for its sole use. For this newsletter, I used the [P22 Underground](#) font (1997) which revived the original 1916 Johnston design. ▶

**The Roundel:** Using the new font, Frank Pick had Edward Johnston standardize the design of the "bar and wheel." The design specifications at right (1925) ▶ helped make the [Roundel](#) thrive. Even today it stands out as one of the most recognized, iconic, and imitated logos in the world (see newsletter cover).

**The Tube Map:** In 1931-33 [Harry Beck](#), an engineering draftsman inspired by the angular lines of electric circuit diagrams, created London's iconic [Tube Map](#). ▶ On his own time, he "set about on a project to 'tidy up' the tube map by—as he would later recall—"straightening the lines, experimenting with diagonals and evening out the distance between stations."

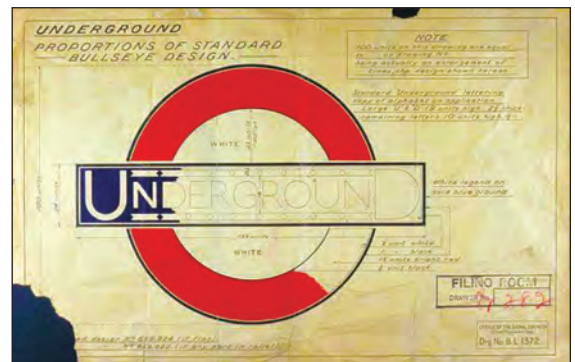
**The Posters:** In the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, The London Underground harnessed the power of [modern graphic posters](#) for publicity and advertising. This newsletter's back cover is a hat tip to that legacy.

**The Colour Palette:** Transport for London has developed a consistent [color discipline](#) to help guide passengers to their destinations. I have adapted many of their colors for this newsletter.

**The Overall Design Discipline:** In my research, I have been impressed by the thoroughness and art of the [TfL's design standards](#) and [Brand Identity](#).

I hope you enjoy this newsletter as another colorful thread woven into our shared history of 1979. Let us be curious together. 🕒

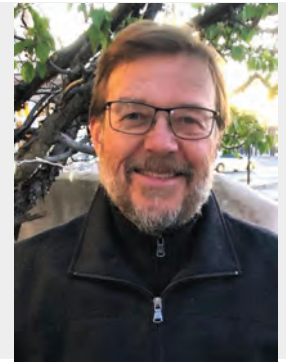

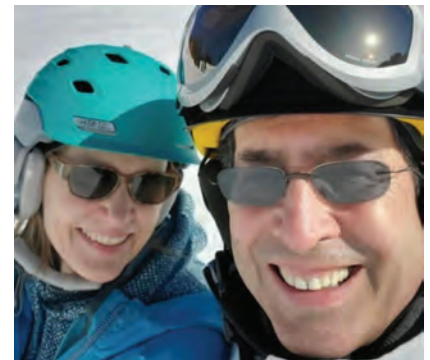

# Sitting on the 1979 Fence with Dr. Lee Jones '79

## Moderated by Dr. Cherie Holmes '79

**P**lease mark your calendar for the next spectacular Sitting on the '79 Fence session, featuring Dr. Lee Jones, the Dean for Medical Education at Georgetown, moderated by Dr. Cherie Holmes, both 79s! Lee and Cherie will discuss the many mental health and educational issues presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, including isolation and uncertainty in patient and medical communities, and the resulting renewed engagement and innovation across Medicine.

Lee obtained his MD from Columbia, and his psychiatry residency at UCLA, with fellowships at Cornell's Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center and the UC San Diego. His experience ranges from a front-line clinician and educator, to chief of multiple overarching services, to service in multiple areas at Association of American Medical Colleges. Lee's portfolio includes work across the range of medical education, from pipeline programs to undergraduate, graduate, and continuing medical education at local, regional, national and international levels. He became Dean at Georgetown in 2021.

Cherie Holmes, a practicing orthopedic surgeon, is currently the Chief Medical Officer for Cheshire Medical Center, a member of the Dartmouth Health system. Cherie graduated from Georgetown Uni-

versity School of Medicine in 1983, completed her residencies at Dartmouth-Hitchcock and Harvard, and then served four years as a Lieutenant Commander and Assistant Clinical Professor of Surgery at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, including a seven-month deployment during Operation Desert Storm/Desert Shield. She joined Cheshire in 1997 and obtained a Master's of Science in health-care management from Harvard in 2012.

## Buddy Teevens '79 Hospitalized After a Bicycle Accident in Florida (3/16/23)

DARTMOUTH COLLEGE, HANOVER, N.H. — Eugene F. "Buddy" Teevens '79, the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach and an avid cyclist, was injured Thursday (3/16) in a bicycle accident in St. Augustine, Florida.

The 66-year-old Teevens, an Ivy League Player of the Year as quarterback at Dartmouth who became the football program's all-time winningest coach, was riding his bicycle when it was involved in a collision. He remains in a hospital in the St. Augustine area, where his family has a home.

As Teevens recovers, the family is not accepting visitors at this time.

A Division I head football coach for more than 30 years, including 23 at Dartmouth, Teevens first coached the Big Green from 1987 through 1991, sharing the Ivy League title in 1990 and winning it outright the following year. After coaching at Tulane and Stanford, he returned to Dartmouth in 2005 and led the team to a share of the Ivy League crown in 2015, 2019 and 2021.

Out of respect for the family, updates on Teevens' condition will be made available in accordance with their wishes. 🕒

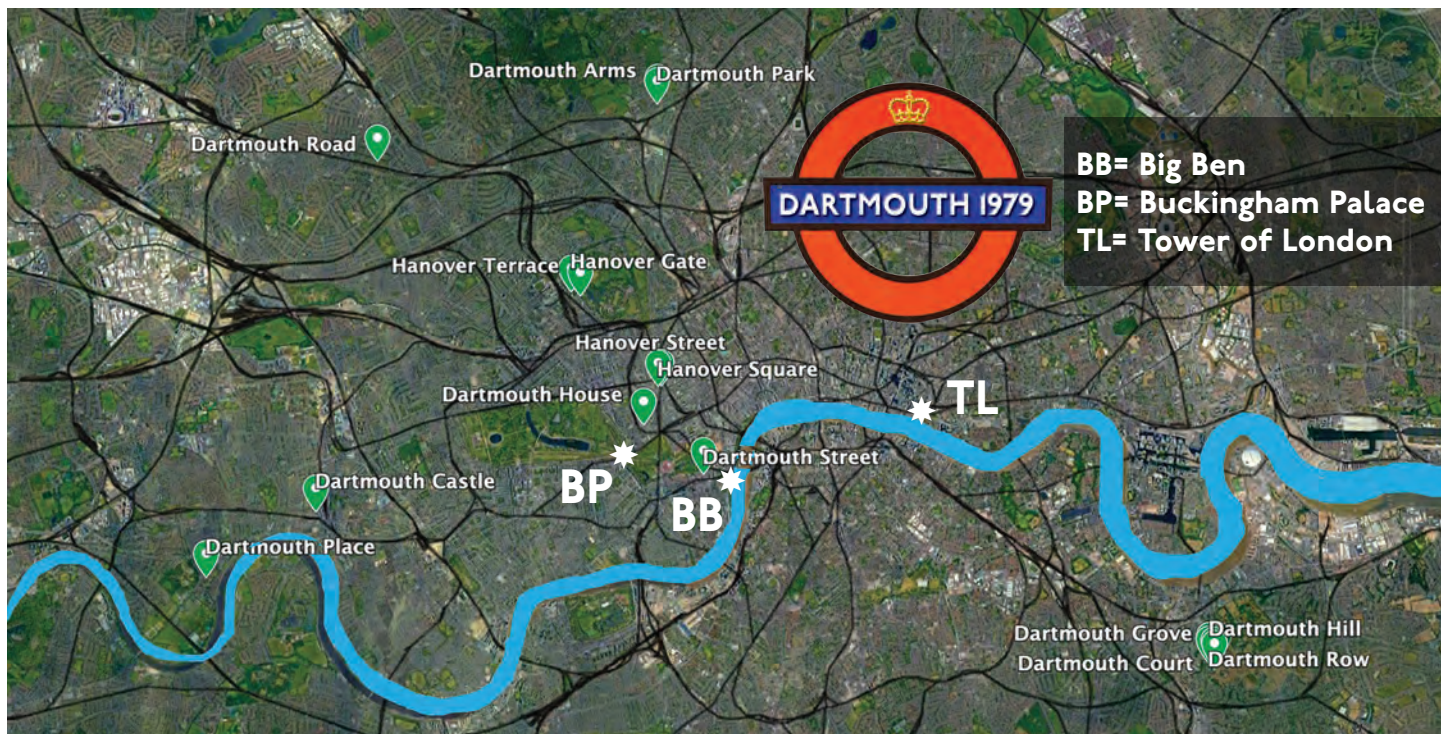
ite places. It’s a privilege to support the College and give back just a little in recognition of all she gave me.
